In his presentation Folke Tegetthoff puts narrative theory to practice: He gives us amazing facts about the ear and steals us away at the same time into the wonderful world of listening.

Why listen?

In our society, hardly anyone listens to the other. "Not being heard," and "not being listened to" can lead to concentration deficits and poor performance especially among children and young adults, and it can also lead to social behavioral problems and an increased propensity to violence.

Whoever is not heard, feels disrespected. Whoever feels ignored or disrespected feels discouraged, frustrated and lonely. To listen means, however, to take time for someone, to show him esteem, respect, and to pay attention. Folke Tegetthoff gives people courage to tell their story, to listen to one another, and to understand. That turns a person into someone who listens and hears, someone who is focused and attentive to living.

Who is this for?

For all people: for adults of all ages and social groups, including children, young people and students from the 3rd grade on of primary school to university

Folke Tegetthoff developed "A Story of Success. From the School of Listening" as an international program that has already been presented in Singapore, Malaysia, India and the United States. **Around 35.000 people have already heard and enjoyed the School of Listening.**
